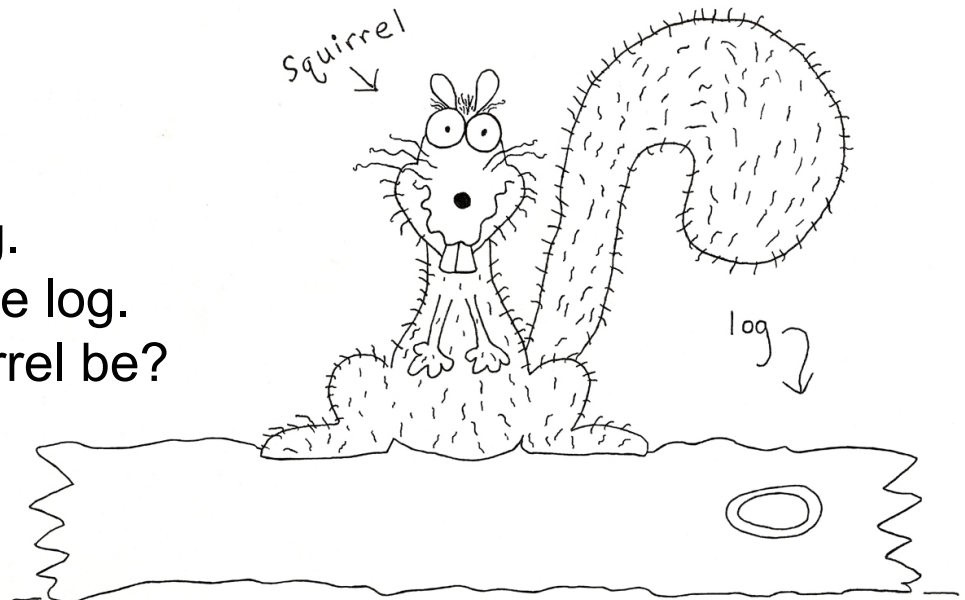

Prepositions

- A preposition is a word that shows the relationship between a noun or pronoun and another word in a sentence.
- Some prepositions are made up of two or more words. These are compound prepositions.

If you have *a squirrel* and *a log* in a sentence, what can their relationship be?

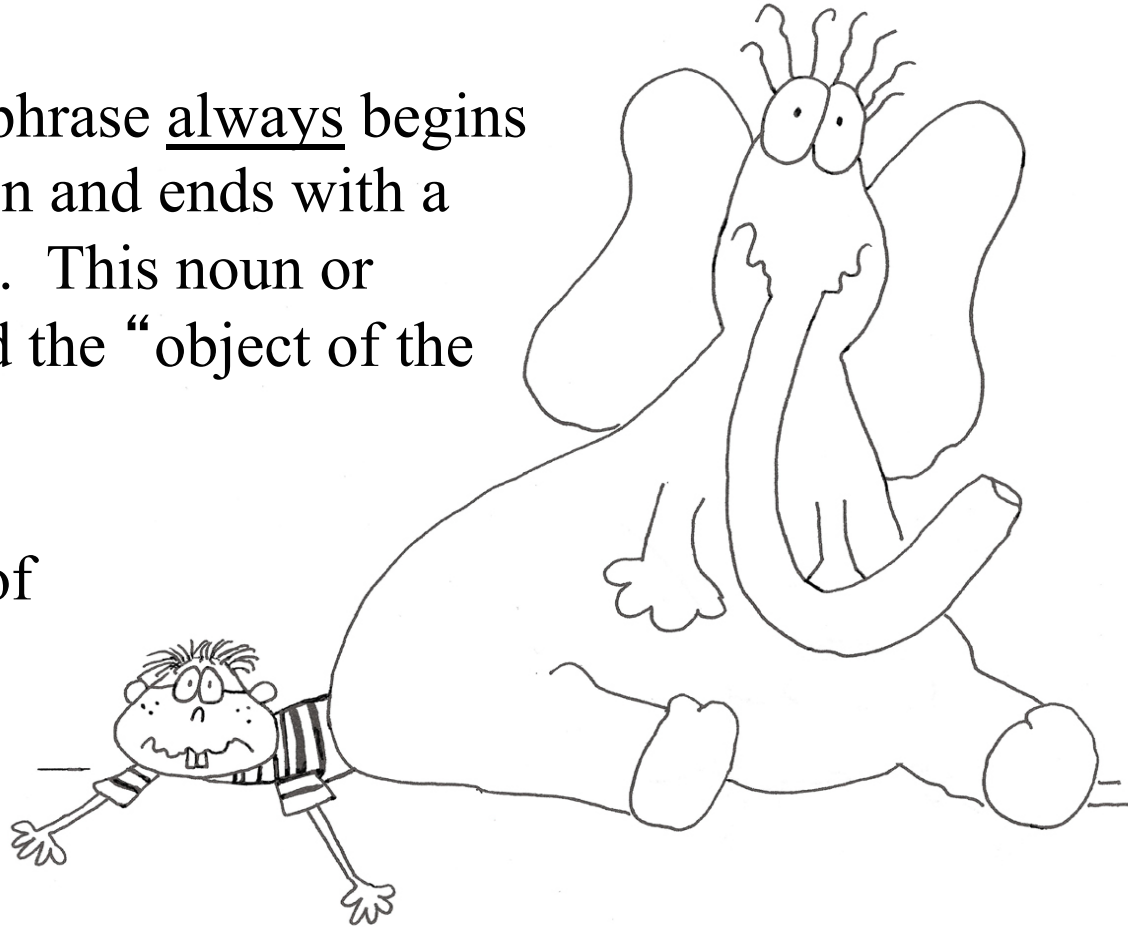
The squirrel is **on** the log.
 The squirrel is **next to** the log.
 Where else can the squirrel be?



Prepositional Phrase

- A prepositional phrase always begins with a preposition and ends with a noun or pronoun. This noun or pronoun is called the “object of the preposition.”

What is the object of the preposition in this sentence?



All of a sudden, Reginald discovered he was wedged **under the leathery, large, yet amiable pachyderm.**

Conjunctions

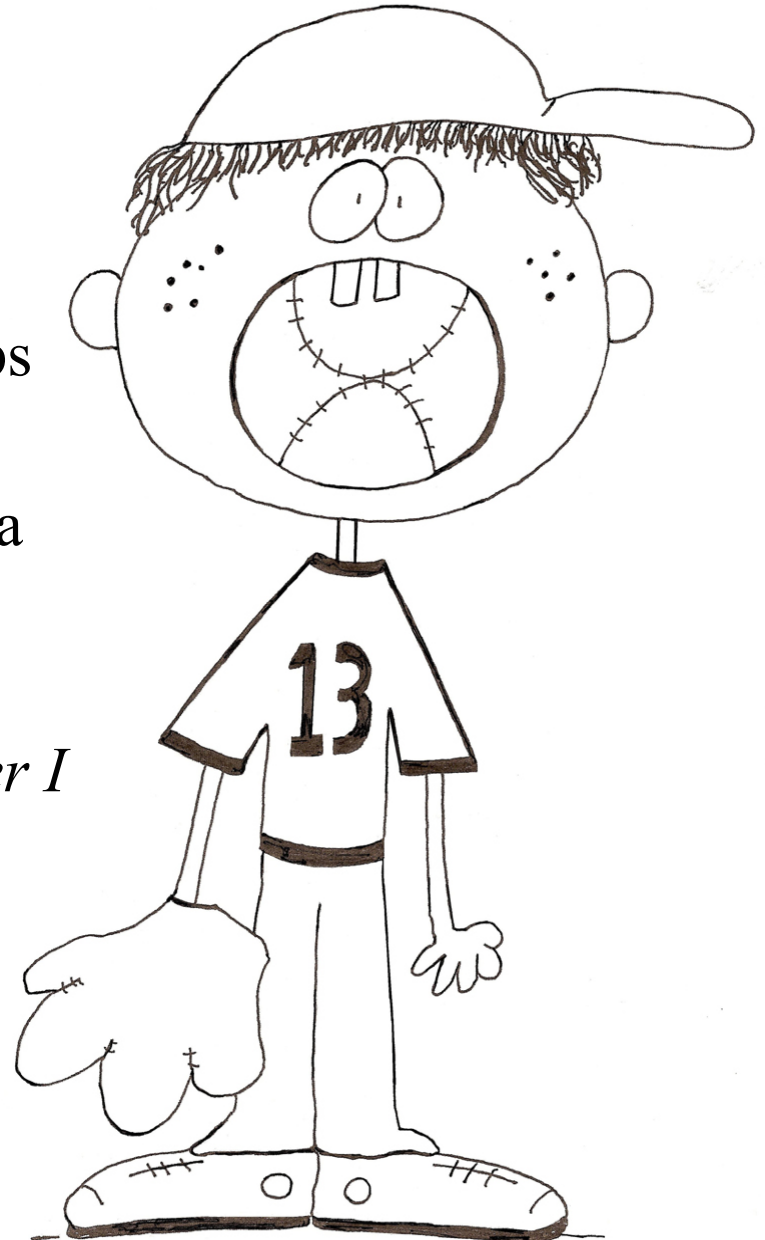

Conjunctions

- Conjunctions are connecting words that join words or groups of words together.
- A coordinating conjunction is a single word: *and*, *but*, *or*.
- Correlative conjunctions are words that come in pairs: *either I or*, *neither I nor*.

for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so



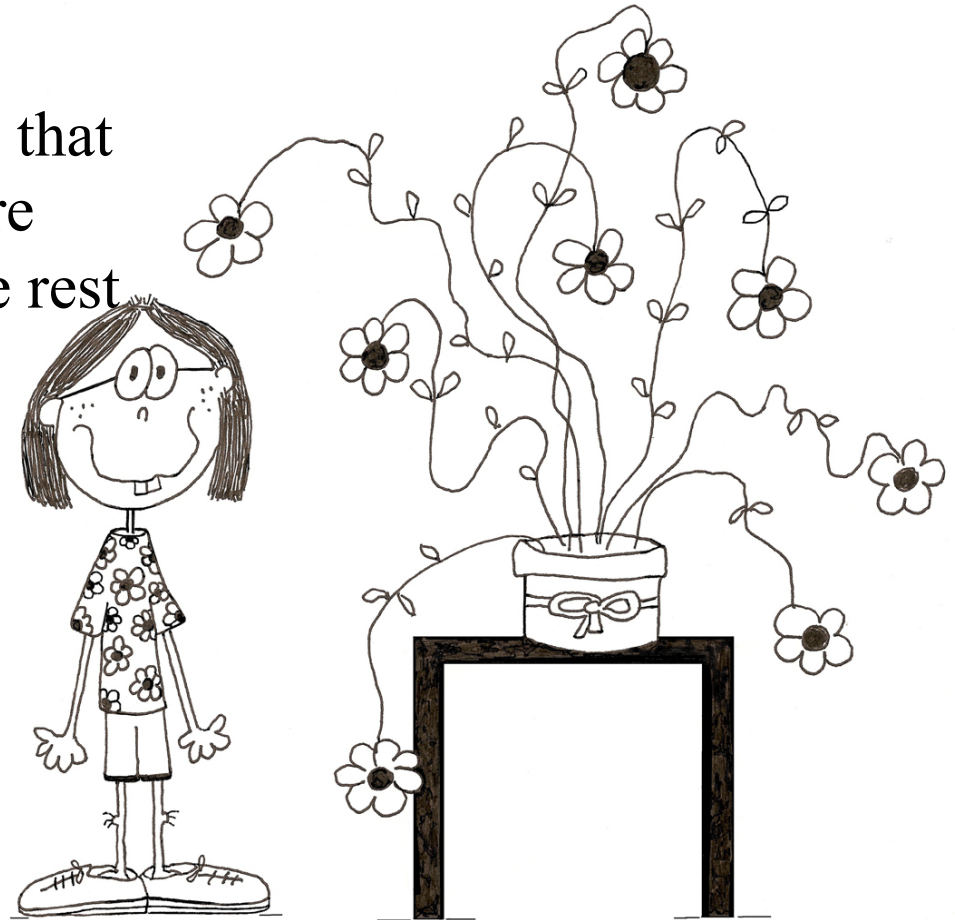
